



## From The Executive Officer

I am excited to share some great news for ATSA!

In collaboration with the University of Wollongong, we have been awarded a three year Australian Research Council (ARC) grant for research into the experiences and needs of electric wheelchair and mobility scooter users. The study into the use and integration of MMDs in society will have the following objectives:

1. To explain the use of powered mobility from the perspective of device users
2. To integrate insights from a range of stakeholders in health, transport, infrastructure, government and industry with user perspectives to explain the context of social mobility use
3. To develop well-justified and legitimate recommendations for change by engaging with citizens about powered mobility
4. To rethink the future of powered mobility through a spatial mobility justice framework; and
5. To inform policy, legislation, regulation and technology development for integrated powered mobility through identifying necessary changes to the built, social and policy environment

ATSA will be calling on the industry to assist in this research, so if you are interested please let me know.

On Friday 17 May, changes were made to the Audit Guidelines for the NDIS Quality & Safeguards Commission (NQSC). However, we are still concerned that the changes have only marginally improved the situation. This is affecting the whole industry, including all healthcare professionals.

ATSA has teamed up with Allied Health Professions Australia (AHPA), the Australian Orthotic Prosthetic Association (AOPA) and Occupational Therapy Australia (OTA) to raise our concerns at Federal Ministerial level. This will take some time to resolve, therefore each business will need to consider its own circumstances and act in their best interests.

If you are not planning to re-register, please share this decision with ATSA in commercial confidence to help us understand the impact of the audit requirements.

## News from the TGA

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) protects the health and wellbeing of the community by regulating and monitoring all therapeutic goods, including medical devices that are imported or supplied in Australia. Regulating these products ensures they are safe to use and perform as intended.

### How do I know if my product is a regulated product?

Unless a product is exempt or excluded, all products that meet the definition of a medical device as outlined in the Therapeutic Goods Act 1989 must be included in the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods (ARTG) before they can be imported or supplied in Australia. In simple terms, a product is a medical device (and is regulated by the TGA) if it:

- Is used on humans;
- Has therapeutic benefits; and
- Generally has a physical or mechanical effect on the body, is used to measure or monitor functions of the body or provides information used for diagnosis or therapy.

Medical devices that TGA regulates range from sticking plasters (ie: band aids) to implantable pacemakers, artificial hips, blood pressure monitors, MRI scanners, syringes and tongue depressors. Please see the following link for more information. If your product is exempt or excluded – for example some low risk products – you do not need your product included in the ARTG.

### Hospital procurement requiring ARTG numbers

Some private and public hospitals continue to request suppliers to have all their products included in the ARTG – despite some products not being a therapeutic good or are exempt. The TGA has written to hospitals to confirm that:

- Not all products are a therapeutic good or need to be included in the ARTG;
- For products that are therapeutic goods, it is recommended that hospitals confirm that the device is included on the ARTG; and
- When a product has a certificate issued based on meeting various standards such as ISO 9001 or ISO 13485, this does not mean the product has met the Australian regulatory requirement.

If a sponsor considers a product is not a therapeutic good (or exempt from having an ARTG listing), but the hospital is precluding you from supply, please advise ATSA or the TGA on [LowRiskDevices@health.gov.au](mailto:LowRiskDevices@health.gov.au).

## Some software is regulated as a medical device

Software including mobile ‘apps’ that meet the definition of a medical device are regulated by the TGA. The TGA is currently consulting on proposed regulatory reforms to have better rules for classifying software according to its risk of causing harm, and clearer requirements for software safety and performance. ## ACCC snapshot

*This information is general in nature and should not be relied upon as legal advice. Business wishing to find out more should contact either the ACCC directly or your legal counsel.*

It is illegal for a supplier to attempt to set a minimum price for their products or services. This practice is known as resale price maintenance (RPM). However, a supplier may recommend that resellers charge an appropriate price for particular goods or services.

A supplier may also withhold the supply of goods when a retailer has sold the goods at below-cost prices for the purpose of attracting customers (loss-leader selling), even where such conduct is not unlawful.

Businesses may obtain legal protection for RPM conduct by lodging a notification with the ACCC.

Once lodged, protection for the notified RPM conduct begins automatically 14 calendar days after the notification was lodged, unless the ACCC issues a draft notice objecting to the notification within those 14 days.

The ACCC may revoke an RPM notification where it is satisfied that the likely benefit to the public from the conduct will not outweigh the likely detriment to the public from the conduct.

## NDIS Fraud

The recent [NDIS Fraud Control Program](#) concluded that the NDIA is largely compliant with requirements.

This was achieved through the use of visible fraud control measures that have been promoted providing the “how to report fraud”. This was combined with the establishment of the NDIS Fraud Taskforce (with the Federal Police and the Department of Human Services).

We understand that there are several investigations underway with an estimate value of \$9.3 million.



The NDIA Fraud Strategy Statement is: "The NDIA has strengthened its fraud control arrangements to protect the Scheme and the Agency from exploitation through fraud. The NDIA and Commonwealth Government will not tolerate fraud or the misuse of funds to support people with disability." Key fraud targets:

- Self-managed participants. For example, use of unregistered providers and low verification thresholds for payments to self-managed participants.
- The split of responsibilities between the NDIA and the NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission.

Several strategies will be deployed to detect fraudulent activities, such as budget variance analysis, participant plan sampling and review, internal audit, and referral pathways with the NDIS Commission. It is planned that in the coming months, these will be improved by more advanced data analytics and data matching activities.

It is understood that due to a growing scheme the temptation for fraud will inevitably grow, however to counter this real risk we should expect more sophisticated fraud control measures to be constantly implemented to protect the NDIS.

## Transfer of Domiciliary Equipment Service (DES) to the Non-Government Sector

The State Government's Domiciliary Equipment Service (DES) is set to transfer its service to a non-government provider later this year.

The upcoming service change follows the State Government's decision to transfer some of its services to non-government management due to national disability reforms.

In mid-January 2019, the State Government conducted a market sounding process to gauge non-government market interest in acquiring DES. An open market Expressions of Interest (EOI) process and Invitation for Proposal process have also recently closed.

DES manages the equipment and home modification needs of approximately 13,700 people in South Australia. This includes clients from the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), South Australian Department of Human Services (DHS), a range of hospitals and community care agencies, and people privately hiring equipment.

During the transition of DES to the new provider, the State Government will work closely with agencies which use DES services, suppliers, and staff to make sure that there is continuity of service for clients and that the transfer to the new provider happens in a planned and smooth way.

It will continue to be business as usual for DES until otherwise stated.

## ENABLENSW Update

### Updated information security requirements for HealthShare NSW suppliers

If your business is a registered supplier with HealthShare NSW (HSNSW), there is a new two-step verification process which has been introduced to help protect vendors from fraudulent activity.

"Our accounts payable team processes thousands of financial transactions each day," said Peter Stralow, Manager Service Centre Westmead. "With cybercrime on the rise, we are committed to ensuring valuable business and account information is not compromised, and we encourage our suppliers to revisit their security requirements on a regular basis."

Here are some things for HSNSW suppliers to keep in mind:

- All changes to your account must be made in writing
- You will be asked to verify your bank details by a team member. You will be asked a set of questions to verify the nature of the call.

As a general reminder, HealthShare NSW encourages suppliers to use the NSW Health Supplier portal to upload and view invoices if requesting payment of a purchase order. Registering is easy and can be done in under five minutes by submitting a form online at [www.healthshare.nsw.gov.au](http://www.healthshare.nsw.gov.au).

The portal is a secure and safe internet-based interface that allows you to submit invoices for payment and includes reporting capabilities to give you the control you need to manage your financial transactions including tracking the progress of your submitted invoices.
